PROGRAM OVERVIEW

The Institute is an exciting behind-the-scenes exploration of power and politics in California. The program begins Wednesday, August 1st, at the University of California, Davis, with an orientation on the issues and policies that dominate the lives of people in the United States, and the interactive campaign project that each student will participate in. The program will conclude on Saturday afternoon, August 4th (specifics below).

From Wednesday through Saturday of the Institute week, you will have a unique opportunity to explore the complexities of social, economic and political issues that present barriers to everyday life of people in this country. You will meet the organizers and leaders who make important decisions in influencing California politics. These sessions will be held on the UC Davis campus and in the rooms of the Sacramento Capitol, to which we will travel by chartered bus.

Topics of discussion and debate vary during each session, depending upon current events and questions challenging California. Issues we anticipate examining this year include:

- . Prisons, Police Departments and Racial Bias
- . (Dis)abilities and Discrimination
- . Lobbying 101: Influencing Policy
- . Multi-Cultural U.S.: Implications and Opportunities
- . The Politics of the Gender Gap
- . Post-9/11 Islamophobia

- . Media Strategy and Building Movements
- . Sovereignty and Indigenous History
- . Exploitation and Trafficking on Our Soil
- . How Politics are Shaped by the People
- . Migration and the American Dream
- . Toss Your Hat In: Political Campaign School

Each evening students participate in interactive workshops and small group discussions that help bring home the of the media in politics and how politics use the media. These sessions help draw educational lessons from the day's events and prepare students for the next day's speakers. You will also probe the opinions of your peers in lively discussions and debates on current issues in the news.

TUITION & FUNDRAISING

Institute tuition covers housing in a student residence hall at The University of California, Davis, breakfast and dinner on campus, transportation to and from campus to our speaker sites, and all academic activities and materials. However, you will need to bring enough money to buy three lunches and cover transportation to and from the University and the start and end of the program. There are many inexpensive restaurants close to the locations of our speaker sites.

ARRIVAL & REGISTRATION

Registration Date & Time: Wednesday, August 1st, from 10:00 am - 1:00 pm. Please note that students will be responsible for their own lunch, and our first group meal will be dinner on Tuesday, August 1st.

Optional Campus Tour: Wednesday, August 1st, 11:00 am-12:00 pm. Sign-up form will be sent out 2 weeks prior to arrival date via email.

Registration Location: University of California, Davis (UC Davis):

Students will check in at the "Segundo Area Check-In" (see map at the back of this packet), but we will be staying in the Regan Dorms beside the parking lot, so if arriving by car, we suggest that you leave all luggage in the car until *after* check in, so you are not needlessly carrying it back and forth!

<u>Drop-Off Parking</u>: You may park in Visitor Parking 25 (VP 25) adjacent to the Regan Dorms.

Students are responsible for arranging their transportation to UC Davis (Please see attached Transportation Form for information on airport arrivals). Students traveling by adult driven car (or by shuttle from the airport) should arrive at UC Davis no later than 12 pm to ensure appropriate time to move in and unpack. Students may not drive a car to the Institute or have a car at the Institute - NO EXCEPTIONS!

FINAL PROJECT PRESENTATION, COMPLETION CEREMONY & DEPARTURE

Final project presentations and the Institute Completion Ceremony will take place at 1:00 p.m. The Institute will conclude on **Saturday**, **August 4th**, **at 3:00 p.m.**

Students traveling by plane should not make reservations to depart before 5:00 p.m. Students being picked up at the University should be picked up no later than 3:00 p.m.

Students leaving campus at the conclusion of the program with someone other than their parents or guardian must provide written permission from their parents to do so. This permission must be received prior to the program.

HOUSING

Institute students will be housed two or three to a room at UC Davis. Students will be housed on two separate floors, male-identifying and female-identifying. The Institute staff is housed on each floor and all are responsible for the supervision of the students.

Roommate selection is done in advance and cannot be changed. If you would like to share a room with someone you already know, both students must return the enclosed Roommate Request Form to the Junior State of America Foundation Office by **July 6, 2018**.

Students will be responsible for leaving their room in the same condition in which they found it and will be charged for any damages that occur. The cost to replace a lost room key or security access card is \$75.00. If you lose your key during the week, you will be asked to pay the \$75 before you leave. *Make sure to bring a keychain or neck lanyard so you will not lose your key or access card.*

PACKING LIST

- Bedding: Students are provided with a pillow, linens for their bed and towels, but no blanket.
- Money: All Meals are provided except lunch on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. Students will be supervised as they may choose their lunch options at local food courts.
- <u>Dress Clothes:</u> The dress code for daytime sessions on Thursday, and Friday is business attire, however, arrival day, departure day and the evening sessions are casual. When meeting public officials, you should dress as if you were going to a job interview. **Jeans, shorts, T-shirts, spaghetti straps and tank tops, and tennis shoes, and flip-flops are not appropriate attire for meeting with our speakers.**
- <u>Casual Clothes:</u> Remember to pack comfortable shoes as we will be doing a good deal of walking. Also, be sure to bring comfortable informal clothing to wear on campus at UC Davis in the evenings. There will be some time for informal recreation during the week.

Suggested Items to bring:

- Blanket
- Lunch money for Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday
- Toiletries and Towels (including soap and shampoo)
- 3 days of business attire for daytime activities on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday
- 5 days of casual attire (all evenings are casual)
- Comfortable dress shoes
- Casual shoes

Students should not bring valuable items to the Institute. While the dormitory is staffed 24 hours a day, we will be off campus during the day. Neither The University of California, Davis, nor The Junior State of America Foundation can assume responsibility for your personal belongings.

INSTITUTE RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Students must reside in Institute housing during the week. Under no circumstances can they commute to the program.
- 2. Students must attend all Institute functions unless excused by a staff member.
- 3. Students are not permitted to leave campus without permission. They may not leave with a relative (other than their parents) or any other adult unless <u>specific written permission is</u> received from their parents in advance.
- 4. Students may not drive a car during the week or ride in a car unless it is driven by a staff member.
- 5. Students are to be in their own room and quiet at 11:00 p.m. each night.
- 6. No use of illegal drugs, alcohol, or cigarette smoking will be permitted.
- 7. Housing is segregated by male and female identifying floors and students may not be any floor but their own.
- 8. Harassment, sexual or otherwise, of any other student, or staff person, will not be permitted.
- 9. Other common sense rules may be announced by the Institute Director, as the need arises.

Violation of these rules can result in students being sent home without refund and other appropriate action.

VISITORS

Because the Institute is a short, intensive week of politics and government, no visitors are allowed during the week. The only exception is that parents may visit. Parental visits, if necessary, should be limited to a few minutes in the evening and should not conflict with any scheduled event.

EXPERIENCE THE JUNIOR STATE OF AMERICA THROUGH JSA-STYLE DEBATES

Throughout the Institute, you will participate in lively discussions and debates on current issues with your peers. These debates are an excellent introduction to the **Junior State of America**, the largest, student-run political education organization in the country! Founded 80 years ago by high school students, JSA today involves over 10,000 participants across the country.

We will have an affirmative speaker and a negative speaker for each debate resolution. Each resolution will also have three subsequent speakers in favor of each side (for a total of six subsequent speakers per debate). The affirmative speaker will speak first, followed by the negative speaker. Then each subsequent speaker will speak, alternating between pro and con (starting with pro). Lastly, the con speaker will give a closing statement, followed by a closing statement from the affirmative speaker. Participants will vote on the debate resolution at the end of the debate. An experienced JSA leader will act as the moderator for each debate, ensuring that each runs smoothly. Below are sample topics for our debates and thought-talk discussions.

SAMPLE DEBATE TOPICS:

- 1) RESOLVED, that all use of excessive force by police by independently investigated.
- 2) RESOLVED, that the United States should shut down Guantanamo Bay.
- 3) RESOLVED, that class inequality is a bigger problem in the US than racial inequality.
- 4) RESOLVED, that the United States end all military alliances with countries that violate human rights

SAMPLE THOUGHT TALK TOPICS:

On political correctness: Does "PC" culture inhibit productive political conversation? Overall, Is immigration beneficial to the United States economy and society?


MAP OF REGAN DORMS IN SEGNDO AREA FOR DROP OFF AND PICK UP
